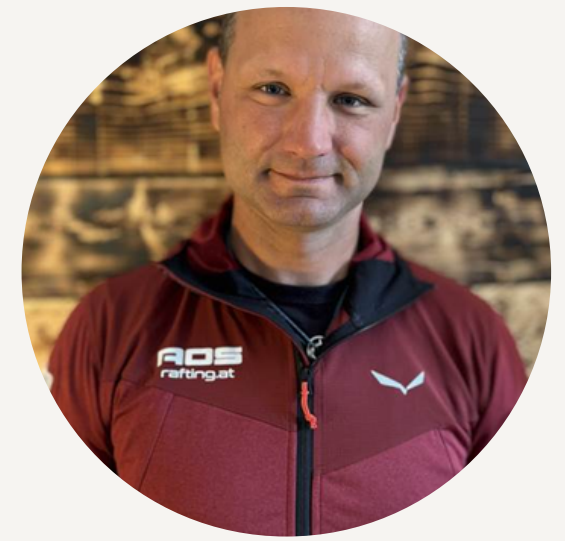

Certification

Upon successful completion of the workshop and passing the IRF assessment, participants will receive certifications as IRF Raft Guide and Raft Trip Leader at appropriate levels.
